Sats at risk

Satellites, including those used for GPS and communications, will face greater risks in coming decades during solar-triggered geomagnetic storms because of the effect climate pollution has on Earth's atmosphere, a new study has found.

The increasing volume of planet-warming carbon dioxide in the upper atmosphere is likely to make the air less dense, while geomagnetic storms have the opposite effect: The ensuing rapid changes in density as a result could cause serious troubles for satellite operations, reports CNN.

This study, published in the journal Geophysical Research Letters, comes at a time when the world is growing more dependent on satellite networks for everything from internet access to navigation, as well as military applications.

Geomagnetic storms occur when charged particles from the Sun interact with the Earth's upper atmosphere. Their most visible impact is the auroras that light up the sky with green, purple and pink light. But strong storms can wreak havoc on satellite operations and communication.

Solar storm

The researchers found that by later this century, the upper atmosphere would be 20 per cent to 50 per cent less dense at the peak of a solar storm similar to the 2024 event. The relative change would be greater, going from a doubling of density during such an event to a potential tripling.

The bigger the spike, the bigger the impact on a satellite's orbit, Pedatella told CNN: "If you have a really big increase in density, then the satellite kind of comes down closer to Earth." The satellites being designed today need to take these climate change-related impacts into account, rather than basing their engineering on historical calculations, he added.

how dense the air is in these thin upper layers, making it difficult for satellites to maintain their speed and altitude and potentially make them sink, cutting down on their operational lifetimes.

Geomagnetic storms later this century that are of similar intensity to those today will cause bigger spikes in atmospheric density because Earth's upper atmosphere will be less dense overall,

the researchers found, using a supercomputer to model changes in the entirety of Earth's atmosphere. This study breaks new ground by showing how much the atmosphere's density could change during strong geomagnetic storms.

The scientists analysed how the atmosphere would respond to the same event in different years: 2040, 2061 and 2084.

To perform the experiment, they used a supercomputer that can simulate the entirety of the Earth's atmosphere, including the thinner, upper layers, to show how changes in the composition of the lower levels can alter the characteristics at much higher altitudes.

For the satellite industry, this is an especially important question because of the need to design satellites for specific atmospheric conditions," lead author Nicholas Pedatella of the National Centre for Atmospheric Research told CNN.



Op Sindoor hallmark of defence self-reliance: Murmu

In ID speech, President hails nation's economic growth

New Delhi, Aug 15: President Draupadi Murmu today said Operation Sindoor was a test case of Atmanirbhar Bharat (self-reliant) in Defence sector and will go down in history as an example in humanity's fight against terrorism.

In her address to the nation on the eve of the 79th Independence Day the President said what was most noticeable in Operation Sindoor was the nation's unity which is also the most befitting response to those who wanted to divide the country.

"The outcome had proved that we are on the right path. Our indigenous manufacturing has achieved the critical level that makes us self-sufficient in meeting many of our security requirements. These are landmark achievements in India's defence history since Independence," she said.

Describing the killing of innocent citizens on holiday in Kashmir as "cowardly and utterly inhuman," she said India responded in a decisive manner and with steely resolve.

Operation Sindoor showed that our armed forces are prepared to meet any eventuality when it comes to guarding the nation, she said and added that with strategic clarity and technical capability, they destroyed terrorist hubs across the border.

"I believe, Operation Sindoor will go down in history as an example in humanity's fight against terrorism." The President said India's unity was on display also in the multi-party delegations of the Members of Parliament that reached out to various nations to explain India's position.

"The world has taken note of India's stance that we will not be the aggressor, but we will not hesitate to retaliate in defence of our citizens," she added.

President Murmu said India is the fastest growing among major economies in the world with a GDP growth rate of 6.5 in the last fiscal and is well on way to becoming a self-reliant nation moving forward with great confidence.

In her address to the nation on the eve of 79th Independence Day the President said India's economy is in the "pink of health" and even amid stress in global economy, demand at home is pacing ahead.

Calling for a resolve to buy and use Indian products, the President said the idea of Swadeshi has been inspiring our national endeavours like Make-in-India initiative and Atmanirbhar Bharat Abhiyan. "Let us resolve to buy and use Indian products," she added.

She said the all-round economic growth complemented by social sector initiatives has placed India well on the path of becoming a developed economy by 2047. With the nation marching ahead during the Amrit Kaal, three sections of society will lead India on this path - youth, women and the communities that had for long remained on the margins.

"Inflation has remained under control. Exports are rising. All key indicators show the economy in the pink of health. This is as much due to carefully calibrated reforms and sagacious economic management as due to the hard work and dedication of our

workers and farmers." She said business leaders, small and medium industries and traders always exhibited a can-do spirit and removing bottlenecks in the path of wealth creation was needed.

The National Highway network under the Bharatmala Pariyojana had been strengthened. The Railways too have innovated, introducing new types of trains and coaches equipped with latest technologies.

Describing the inauguration of the rail link in Kashmir valley as a major accomplishment, the President said rail connectivity with the valley will boost trade and tourism in the region and open new economic possibilities. This engineering marvel at Kashmir is a historic milestone for our country.

The President said the Government has been paying special attention to improve the conditions of the cities. Addressing the key area of urban transport, the Government has expanded metro rail facilities. The number of cities with a metro rail service has gone up multifold in a decade.

The Government considers the basic amenities of life as rightful claims of the citizens. The Jal Jeevan Mission is making progress in providing tap water supply to rural households.

Modi said the government has abolished over 40,000 compliances, repealed 1,500 outdated laws, and simplified dozens more-removing 280 provisions in the last parliamentary session alone. Key reforms include faceless tax assessment, zero tax for income up to Rs.12 lakh, and the replacement of colonial-era criminal laws with the Indian Justice Code.

Boost for Entrepreneurs and MSMEs

Announcing a Task Force for Next-Generation

Reforms, the PM said it will review all economic laws to cut compliance costs, ensure freedom from arbitrary legal actions, and promote ease of doing business.

Next-Gen GST by Diwali

Modi promised "Next Generation GST reforms" this Diwali, aimed at lowering taxes on essential goods-calling it a festive gift for citizens.

He urged the nation to focus on self-reliance and expansion of capabilities, saying the reforms will make India more resilient, inclusive, and globally

competitive.

Modi said that areas once plagued by Naxalism have been transformed into "green corridors" of development during his government's 11-year tenure.

Recalling the decades of violence in tribal regions, Modi said, "A vast tribal belt bled for years under the grip of Naxalism. Mothers lost their children, young sons were misled, and lives were destroyed." He noted that the insurgency, once entrenched in over 125 districts, is now confined

to about 20.

New announcements included the Sudarshan Chakra Mission-a national defense shield by 2035-Rs.1 lakh crore employment scheme aiming for 3.5 crore jobs, and a hinted "GST gift" this Diwali through possible slab reforms.

On the tech front, he pushed deep-sea exploration, a homegrown space station, indigenous fighter jet engines, and fast-tracked semiconductor manufacturing. While the vision was sweeping, doubts remain over execution, with some warning that grand rhetoric risks outpacing delivery.

Landslide hits vehicular traffic in Anantnag

Srinagar, Aug 15:

A landslide struck the Larnoo-Murgon Top area of Jammu and Kashmir's Anantnag district late last night, leaving nearly 30 vehicles stranded, officials said.

According to officials, the State Disaster Response Force (SDRF) Rescue Team Anantnag, assisted by local police and the civil administration, launched a swift rescue operation soon after the incident.

"All passengers and drivers trapped due to the landslide were safely

evacuated. There has been no report of loss of life or damage to property," an official said.

The rescue operation, which continued during the night under challenging conditions, was successfully concluded by morning.

On Friday, cloudbursts and flash floods were reported across several districts of Kashmir, including Ganderbal, Anantnag, and Kupwara. Officials said that no fatalities or injuries have been reported so far.
