## Climate action

Britain's newest Indian-origin Cabinet minister, Claire Coutinho, has spoken of the shared energy and climate change goals between the two countries in her first major diaspora speech as UK Secretary of State for Energy and Net Zero.

The 38-year-old Goan-origin Conservative MP, promoted by Prime Minister Rishi Sunak in a recent Cabinet reshuffle, joked about settling somewhat of a trend as the latest British Indian member in frontline British politics at a diaspora Diwali reception organised by India Global Forum (IGF) in London on Thursday evening.

As the second Cabinet minister of Goan heritage after Home Secretary Suella Braverman, Coutinho stressed the "hugely important" India-UK partnership and the potential for further collaboration in the climate action sphere. "I am not the first British Indian Cabinet member. I'm not even the first Goan Cabinet member because we are starting quite a trend in this country," said Coutinho.

"The relationship, that living bridge that we have with India, is so valuable because we share so many goals, and energy

and climate change is no different. The innovation, the people, the finance expertise, the brilliant technologies that we are working across borders is hugely important to us to make sure that we can achieve our goal together," she said.

From the Labour Party, shadow secretary for Business and Trade Jonathan Reynolds highlighted the Opposition's commitment to the ongoing negotiations towards an India-UK free trade agreement (FTA).

"As a member of the shadow cabinet with responsibility for trade, I am keeping a very close eye on those trade negotiations. I know that trade deals aren't easy to deliver, but if they are done right, could, and, I think would, deliver a new golden age of British Indian cooperation. We are very much committed in principle on the Labour side to seeing that [FTA] succeed," he said.

India and the UK have been negotiating an FTA since January last year, to significantly boost the estimated GBP 36 billion bilateral relationship. However, the talks have missed a few expected completion points, and with both countries headed into a

general election year in 2024, there is a growing question mark around it being achieved under the current leadership. "We cannot allow this relationship to become a political football that is tossed around in the political arena. I am therefore so pleased that, as every year, we have representatives from both the main political parties," said IGF Founder and CEO Manoj Ladwa. The annual Diwali event, attended by cross-party parliamentarians, diplomats, entrepreneurs and business chiefs, is a celebration of the India-UK diaspora.

## Bring terror perpetrators to justice, Pak urged

## India, US 2+2 meet mulls Afghan status

New Delhi, Nov 11: In a veiled message to Pakistan, India and the US on Friday reiterated their condemnation of the 26/11 Mumbai attack and called for bringing the perpetrators to justice.

In a joint statement at the end of the '2+2' Foreign and Defence Ministerial dialogue, New Delhi and Washington unequivocally condemned terrorism and violent extremism, and the use of terrorist proxies and logistical, financial or military support to terror groups.

US Secretary of State Antony Blinken and Defence Secretary Lloyd Austin led the American delegation at the talks while the Indian side was headed by External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar and Defence Minister Rajnath Singh.

The two sides also deliberated on the situation in Afghanistan and called on the Taliban to adhere to their commitment to prevent any group or individual from using the territory of Afghanistan to threaten the security of any country.

India and the US also urged the Taliban to respect the human rights of all Afghans, including women, children, and members of minority groups and uphold freedom of travel.

"India and the US reiterated their condemnation of the 26/11 Mumbai attack and the Pathankot attack and called for bringing the perpetrators of these attacks to justice," the statement said.

"The ministers also called for concerted action against all terrorists, including through designations of individuals affiliated with groups that are listed by the UN Security Council 1267 Sanctions Committee, such as Al-Qa'ida, ISIS/Daesh, Lashkar-e-Tayyiba, and Jaish-e-Mohammed," it said.

Pakistan-based terror groups were behind the 26/11 and 2016 Pathankot attacks. The ministers emphasised the importance of upholding international standards on anti-money laundering and combating the financing of terrorism, consistent with Financial

## Blinken, Austin meet Modi

The India-US partnership is truly a force for global good, Prime Minister Narendra Modi said after US Secretary of State Antony Blinken and Defence Secretary Lloyd Austin jointly called on him Friday after conclusion of the '2+2' ministerial dialogue.

Defence Minister Rajnath Singh and External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar were also present at the meeting between Modi and the two visiting American officials.

"Glad to receive @SecBlinken and @SecDef. The '2+2' Format is a key enabler for further strengthening the India-US Comprehensive Global Strategic Partnership," Modi said on X.

Action Task Force (FATF) recommendations.

Both the countries reiterated their commitment to work together in FATF and other multilateral platforms. "They

expressed determination to counter new and emerging forms of terrorism and violent extremism and the use of emerging and evolving technologies such as unmanned aerial

systems and the internet for terrorist purposes," the statement said.

It said the ministers decided to convene the 20th meeting of the India-US joint working group on counter terrorism and the fifth designations dialogue at a mutually convenient date early next year. "Both sides are looking forward to the next edition of the homeland security dialogue in 2024, where leaders will advance security cooperation, through capacity building and other activities."

The two sides also recognised the need to bolster protection of critical networks and information infrastructure.

The ministers also deliberated on the situation in Afghanistan.

"The ministers called on the Taliban to adhere to their commitment to prevent any group or individual from using the territory of Afghanistan to threaten the security of any country and noted UN Security Council Resolution 2593 (2021), which demands that Afghan territory not be used to threaten or attack any country or to shelter or train terrorists, or to plan or finance terrorist attacks," the statement said. "They also emphasised unhindered access to deliver humanitarian assistance and recommitted to having consultations on Afghanistan to help facilitate an inclusive and peaceful future for all Afghans," it said.

## Russia designs drones that can carry 250 kg cargo

Moscow, Nov 11: The Russian long-range transport drone TRAMP (transport aviation multifunctional platform) has completed the first stage of flight tests, Russia's RIA Novosti reported today.

TRAMP, capable of carrying up to 250 kg of cargo over a distance of more than 600 km, was undergoing ground tests. The drone was equipped with a standard engine

with a large three-bladed propeller, and standard reinforced landing gear instead of technological ones used for ground taxing. The feature of the drone is a large cargo compartment with a volume of 2,650 liters. It allows you to load the dimensional cargo on board, as well as drop it non-stop with a parachute to a given point. The cruising speed of the device is 195 km per

hour, the cruising ceiling is 3,000 meters. TRAMP is a flying device of a classic airplane scheme with a high straight wing and a two-keel V-shaped tail. The engine is located in the front part of the fuselage. TRAMP can be used for civilian purposes, such as cargo transportation, forest monitoring, and agricultural spraying. Its compartment can accommodate radar,

optical, mapping and other special equipment.

The reinforced chassis with large-diameter tires allows it to take off and land on short, poorly prepared sites. It also has a built-in parachute rescue system to save the drone and the cargo in case of emergencies. The drone's design is simple and modular, allowing for easy replacement of the wing, engine, and chassis in field conditions.
